Greene County Tobacco Control Program

Enforcement Compliance Checks

Several years ago, the Pennsylvania Department of Health began providing funding to the Greene County Tobacco Control Program to assure compliance with Act 112 of the Pennsylvania Crimes Code. Act 112 forbids the sale of tobacco to anyone under 18.

An officer conducts several rounds of enforcement compliance checks per year to verify that tobacco retailers and their employees are not selling tobacco products to youth under age 18. In the event of a violation, the officer issues citations to both the retailer and the employee making the sale.

Smokeless Tobacco Included in Act 112

Please note that smokeless tobacco is a tobacco product covered by Act 112. This includes, but is not limited to, chewing tobacco, dipping tobacco and snuff. Retailers are reminded to not sell these products to youth under age 18.

Training Tips for Retailers

To assure compliance with Act 112, please train employees on a regular basis to:

- Ask for a valid photo ID
- Refuse sales to youth under 18
- Handle confrontational situations
- Deal with peer pressure (for younger employees)
- Understand store policy and state laws
